DULUTH HERITAGE SPORTS CENTER

The Duluth Heritage Sports Center, which opened in the spring of 2008, has become the “preferred” destination for amateur sports enthusiasts from the entire upper Midwest and Canada. Located at 120 South 30th Avenue West, the complex sits at the former Clyde Iron Industrial site, now known as Clyde Park.

The facility is filled with sports memorabilia, from the region’s rich sports history and includes recognition of the numerous individuals, families and businesses who contributed to help make the Center a reality. Sill Arena seats 1,400 spectators in a circular fashion around a year-round NHL-size ice rink. It’s home to Duluth’s high school hockey teams and the Duluth Amateur Hockey Association. The adjoining Heritage Pavilion houses another NHL-size sheet of ice for the fall & winter hockey season. In April, quality synthetic turf replaces the ice, making an excellent venue for high school spring sports practice and for early season youth soccer.

The Center is also home to the Dave Goldberg Family Branch of the Duluth Boys & Girls Club who occupies the upper level in the concourse.

A conductor checks your ticket and calls out “All Aboard!” Three short blasts of the whistle and your adventure begins. As the train pulls out of the historic Union Depot in downtown Duluth, your narrator explains the history of our region and the role that railroads played in its development. Two lines of steel lead the train through the city, Canal Park, along the rugged shoreline of Lake Superior and deep into the majestic Northwoods. Riding in vintage open and air-conditioned coaches, you'll cross over North Shore rivers that splash and tumble towards Lake Superior. Riding the train is great fun! Excursions run seven days a week during the summer, weekends in the spring and fall. Take the 1 1/2-hour Lester River Trip, a six-hour excursion to Two Harbors or the popular family “Pizza Train.” There are “Elegant Dinner Trains,” “Murder Mystery Trains,” “The Grandma’s Marathon Special” and others. (See Lake Superior Railroad Museum and North Shore Scenic Railroad.) Also, walk the streets of Depot Square, a realistic, life-size depiction of downtown Duluth at the turn of the century. One low-priced admission ticket lets you enjoy the

railroad museum plus the St. Louis Historical Society's exhibits featuring regional history, the Duluth Art Institute's two galleries and experience the joy of learning in the Duluth Children's museum. "It is by remembering the injustice of our past that we learn to live with justice in the future." Likenesses of Elias Clayton, Elmer Jackson and Isaac McGhie are enshrined by a solemn memorial in downtown Duluth, right at the intersection where, in 1920, they were victims of a lynch mob. Falsely accused of rape, the three young African-Americans were dragged from jail, tried on the street in front of 5,000-10,000 people, and then hanged in the chaos that ensued. It was perhaps the worst day in Duluth's history, but the dedication of this memorial in 2003 helps begin the healing of the wounds of our past.

This year's Day of Remembrance observance on June 15 at the Memorial marks the 91st anniversary of the tragedy.
