1 | AERIAL LIFT BRIDGE: Follow the Lakewalk here and watch the big ships come in. This alone is worth the visit.

2 | PARK POINT BEACH: Cross the Aerial Lift Bridge and put your feet in the sand for five glorious miles of the world's longest freshwater sandbar, or drive to the Sky Harbor Airport and walk the wilderness trail to the Superior Entry.



3 | WESTERN WATERFRONT TRAIL: Amble along miles of fully accessible graveled path for wildlife viewing opportunities topped only by the nearby Zoo.

4 | THE LAKEWALK: By foot, bike or carriage, jump on a portion of the 7.3-mile path extending from Bayfront Park to the Veterans War Memorials near Fitger's to 60th Avenue East in Lakeside.

5 | SKYLINE DRIVE: The name says it all. Cruise for the 25-mile scenic byway, stopping at secluded parks and overlooks.

6 | BRIGHTON BEACH: This picturesque park with picnic areas and endless stone skipping is a gateway to Minnesota's rugged North Shore.

7 | ROSE GARDENS: In its 2,000-blossom peak, an immaculately groomed gathering spot with gazebo, fountains and benches for graceful gazing. Just steps from Leif Erikson Park, where you can get your toes wet.
